Mr. T. H. Webb was the owner-skipper of the Beth in 1932 when, with a crew of four — R. H. and S. L. Webb, C. R. Bowman and E. B. Stallard — he shipped her to Auckland and sailed her back to Australia. They left Auckland on a 3,000-miles cruise on September 17, and after calling at places en route, reached Sydney on October 28.

They left on November 6, and arrived at Port Adelaide on December 14. Mr. Webb sold Beth to Mr. Bastin, who installed a new engine and modernised the interior.

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
