

MOTOR LAUNCH ARRIVES

Grelka from Britain

At the Royal South Australian Yacht Squadron moorings, Outer Harbor, is a fine motor launch, the Grelka, which was discharged from the Australian Commonwealth freighter Ferndale by the large floating crane of the Harbors Board. This craft weighs 22 tons, and the placing of her in the water aroused much interest.

She was purchased in Britain by Mr. Mark Mitchell, son of Sir William Mitchell, who will return to Adelaide on Saturday by the Naldera.

The Grelka saw service in patrol work on the British coast during the war, and was latterly at Southampton. A petrol-kerosine engine propels her at $9\frac{1}{2}$ knots an hour, and her owner will use the launch, which has a cosy cabin and sleeping accommodation, for cruising and fishing.

Mr. J. H. Boyes accompanied the launch from London, and will be in charge of her engine.
