Yachts to be at Anchor at Glenelg by
One p.m., Saturday, 11th December, in line,
100 yards apart, north of the EDITH, in
the following order:—

- 1st. The EDITH, Commodore
- 2nd. HYGEIA, Vice-Commodore
- 3rd. ZEPHYR, Commodore S.A. Yacht
Club

Other Yachts according to tonnage.

2.

Yachts to be dressed prior to Commo-
dore going on board the EDITH.

3.

Commodore on board EDITH and his
burgee hoisted, yachts simultaneously to
lower flags.

4.

Yachts to follow the evolutions of the

EDITH, maintaining nearly as possible their
distance of one hundred yards apart.

5.

After evolutions, the EDITH will Anchor
with Mainsail set and Ensign flying at
Peak. The other Yachts in their order will
pass under EDITH's stern, dip Ensign, and
crews give three cheers for Commodore, and
return to their moorings.
