

BIG WELCOME PLANNED FOR CRACK YACHT

The SA winner of the Sydney-Hobart yacht race, the ketch Ingrid, is sure of a good welcome when she sails into Outer Harbor, in spite of her indefinite arrival time.

Last news of the Ingrid was that she left Port Fairy on Tuesday morning.

Mr. David Taylor, brother of the Ingrid's captain, Jim Taylor, said he expected the yacht to arrive either late tomorrow or early Saturday morning.

Mrs. Jim Taylor had arranged to sleep at the Royal Yacht Squadron's Outer Harbor clubhouse tomorrow night to be on the spot when her husband returns.

The yacht squadron made plans to welcome the Ingrid at a meeting last night.
