burns, condition serious.

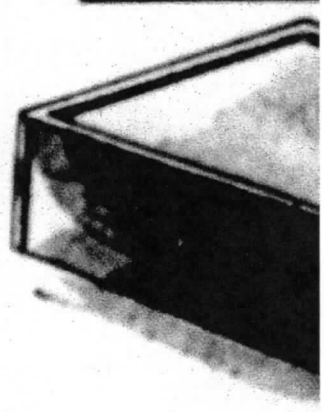
Lorna Harrison, his wife,
