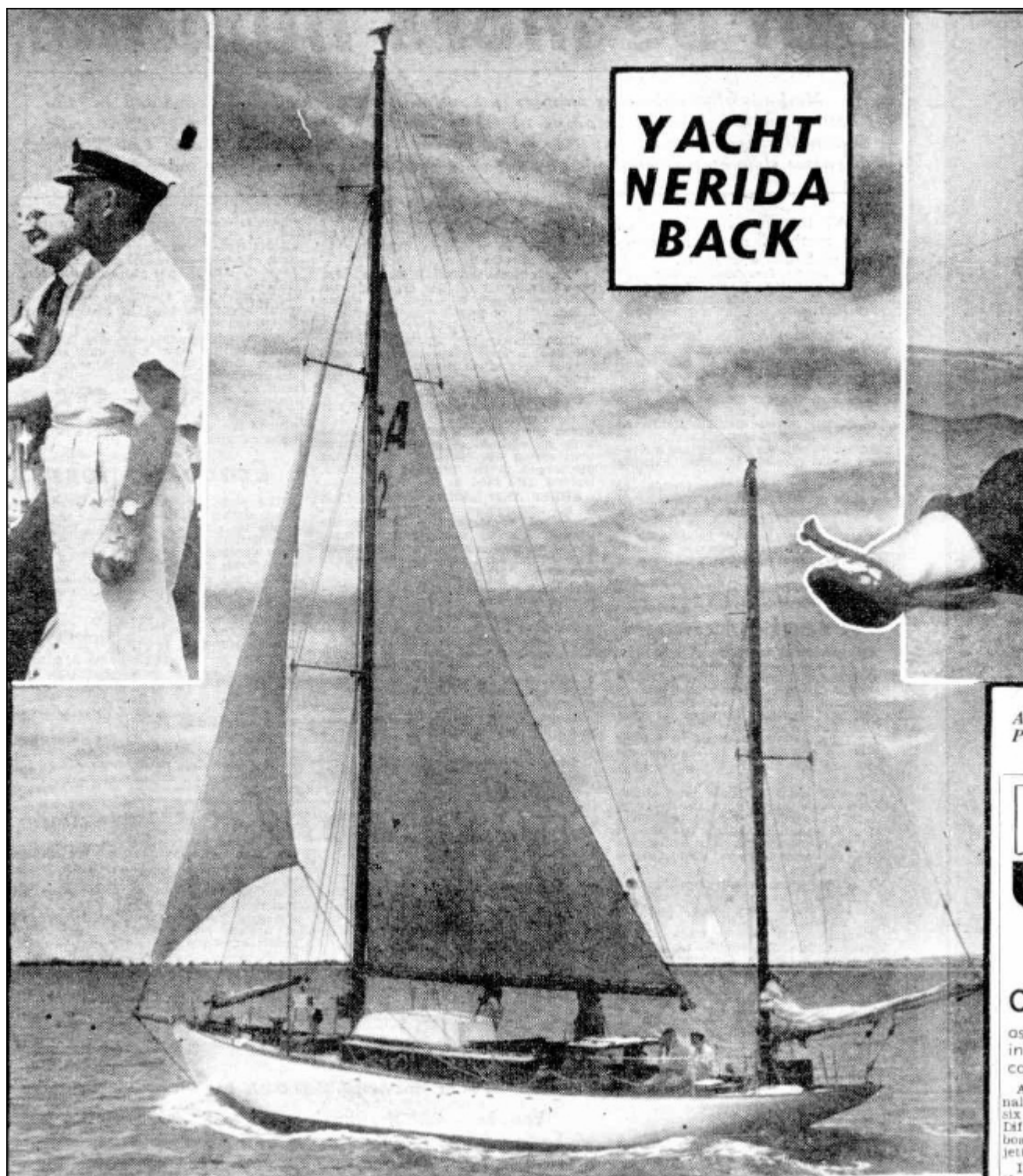


OCEAN YACHT RACE WINNER WELCOMED HO

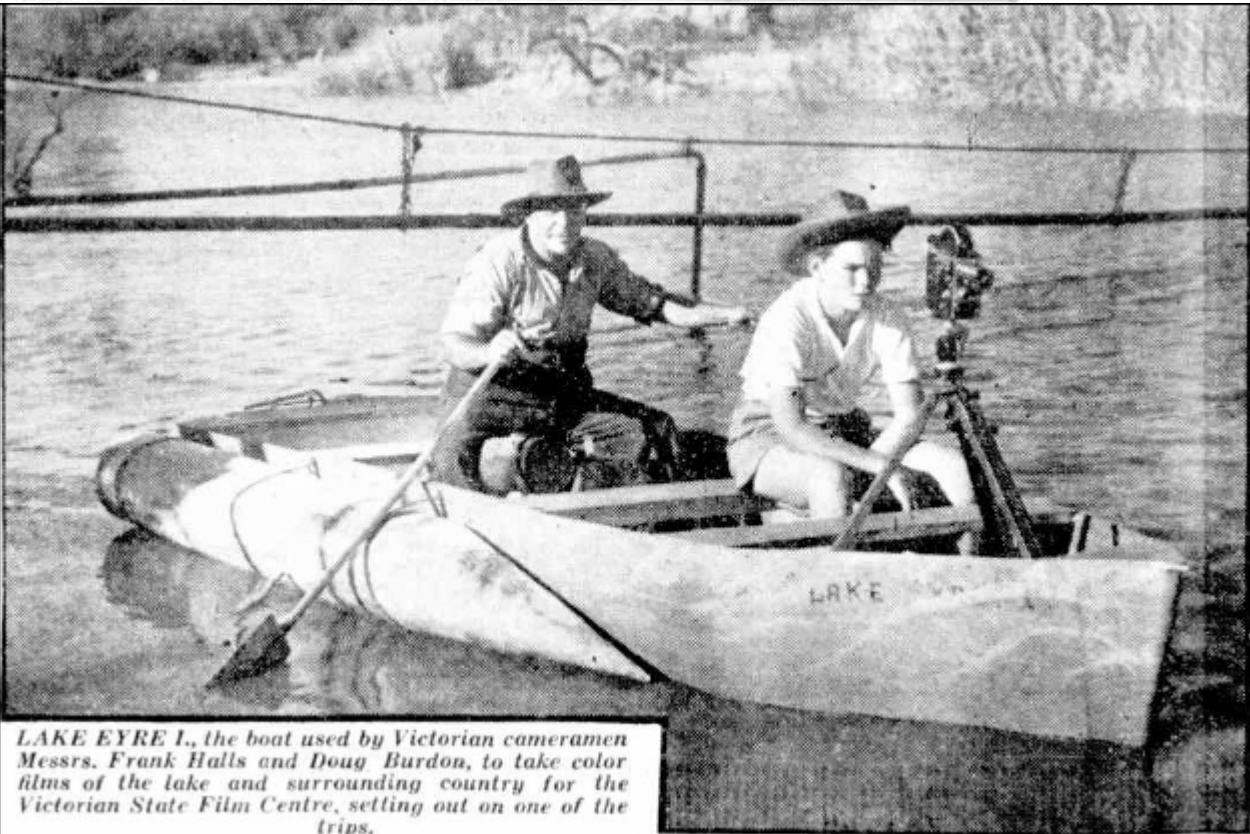

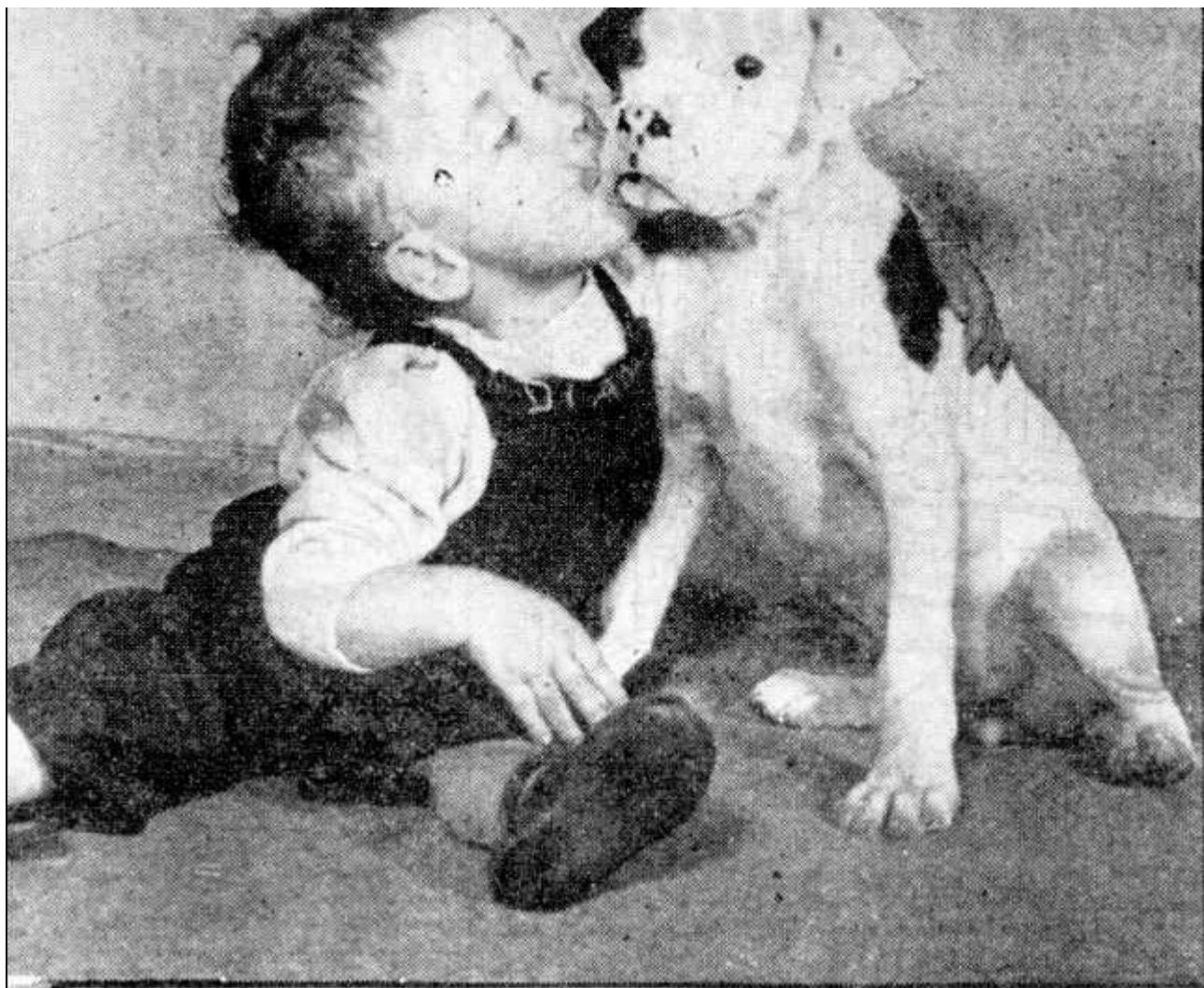
