Extracts from your Centenary Year Book have been brought to my attention concerning the boats NYROCA and BRIGAND (2nd last paragraph, page 14). Yes! NYROCA was built at Langhorne Creek by Mr Frank Potts in 1888.

BRIGAND was also built there but by his son, Fred and launched at Milang on Saturday, 29th November, 1890.

May I quote an extract from Fred Potts' diary:-

"DEC 19-31 1890.

Took NYROCA out on McFarlane's Slip and cleaned her case. Took out BRIGAND and prepared her for Milang Regatta on 29th.

Both boats went to Milang and on 29th BRIGAND had an easy win from NYROCA, GIROFLA and CHALLENGER. PASQUIN was not there."

I am the current owner of BRIGAND and my information is that BRIGAND passed from the Potts of Bleasdale Winery, Langhorne Creek to the Rumbelows, the fishing family of Victor Harbor for conversion to a fishing boat. I purchased her from Mr Frank Judd her owner for 40 years.
