

GOVERNOR WILL SEEK MONSTER SHARK

The Governor (Sir Willoughby Norrie) left this afternoon by air for Kangaroo Island to fish for a monster shark reported off St. Vincent Gulf.

The shark has been reported by six professional fishermen in the past two years in a triangular area between Yorke Peninsula, Kangaroo Island, and Cape Jervis.

Its length has been estimated at 30 ft. and weight at 3,000 lb.—half as big again as the world record catch by Mr. G. R. Cowell.

Last week, Mr. J. Veitch, of Port Lincoln, caught a 2,071-lb. white pointer and is seeking recognition for a world record.

With the Governor, who is one of SA's leading game-fishing enthusiasts, are Lady Norrie, their daughter, Rosemary, and Capt. Gosling, ADC.

The party will spend about a week on Dr. A. L. Tostevin's yacht *Nyroca*, skippered by Dr. Tostevin's son, Mr. Mark Tostevin.

In March, 1950, the Governor landed a world record 2,225-lb. white pointer, but refused to apply for official recognition. He had received assistance when his line became tangled.
